Rap-Shaw members and guests join us for another ultimate Adirondack weekend that will include regional history and wine tasting. On Saturday we will be touring Great Camp Sagamore whose history includes a private residence of the Vanderbilt's, a sportsman's retreat, entertainment headquarters, vacation complex, and an educational institution. People have been enjoying Sagamore and its surrounding wild lands since 1897. The growth and structural alterations that have occurred reflect the varying visions that Sagamore's successive owners have had: William West Durant's use of it as a home; Alfred Vanderbilt's expansions of infrastructure and comforts for his sporting friends; Margaret Emerson's amenities which served friends and family; Syracuse University's use for adult programs; and, the current dedication to stewardship, education and interpretation mold Sagamore.


The guided tour begins in the Upper Complex (or "Workers' Camp"), where you will learn about the history of the workers who built the camp under the direction of W.W Durant, and who maintained and expanded the camp during the ownership of the Vanderbilt family. Next, you will move to the Lower Complex, where you will see the bark-covered Vanderbilt guest buildings, including the famous Main Lodge, which has served as a model for the National Park Service lodge buildings. You will also see the beautiful dining hall overlooking Sagamore Lake, and the Playhouse, where the Vanderbilts entertained their guest. We will complete our visit at your own pace by viewing the permanent exhibits.
